Dear parishioners,

A family that prays together stays together. This little faith catch phrase seen on a few billboards in Chicagoland and seen or heard on a few TV and radio spots from time to time, was first used by Fr. Patrick Peyton as part of the Roman Catholic Family Rosary Crusade. It's a rather straight forward concept and a good one to follow.

In today's gospel, Luke 11:1-13, Jesus is praying and the disciples, no doubt wishing to emulate the Lord, asked Jesus to teach them to pray. And teach them he did, and us too, as he prayed the Our Father—The Lord's Prayer.

Advantages of donating electronically to your parish family

Electronic giving replaces 52 decisions to give weekly. 38% of Catholics decide what they will give on the basis of what is in their checkbook on a given Sunday. Stewardship giving is thoughtful, planned, proportionate and sacrificial. Donating electronically automatically makes you a thoughtful giver.

More important than frequency is faithfulness. You are 100% faithful when you give with your weekly envelope or electronically make an offering. You also provide a more steady flow of income for your parish.

Giving is a public expression of faith. Dropping an envelope into the basket at offertory time shows your participation in your parish. You may write "I give electronically" on your envelope. Your gift still comes from your heart. [as found in Catholic Messenger, Sept. 17]
