Always In His Peace

Dear Dads and All,

A Blessed Father's Day to our dear old dads. Please enjoy your Father's Day gift. It may not treat the whole family but it just may give dad permission to treat the whole family.

Today we celebrate Trinity Sunday, our celebration of our Christian belief that God has revealed the mystery of the "Godhead" as three persons, but one God. Humankind's understanding of God begins in the Old Testament when God revealed himself to Moses. God was not a god among [many] other gods, but the only God. This may not (or may?) seem radical and profound to us Christians, but to the people of the day it certainly was something that was more than a bit challenging to get their minds (and hearts) around. There is but ONE God and there are no other (Genesis 20:3). Hard for people to grasp when they had thought that there were many gods who manipulated humanity and were [had] to be appeased.

This understanding matured for [about] one thousand years. Then, with the birth of Jesus, once again our understanding of who God is became more profound and nuanced. Our God is a God of love and peace. Our "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." (John 3:16)

The early church community grew in their understanding and love of God, especially as revealed in the person of Jesus and in the promised Spirit. They certainly did not get it right all the time. They made their mistakes, but they tried.

We too make our mistakes. We too are challenged by the limitations of our hearts and minds to know our one true God--that God loved us so much he gave us Jesus. And that Jesus loved us so much he gave us the Holy Spirit. We falter in our understanding of who Jesus is and what exactly is the role of the Holy Spirit in our lives.

May I suggest that we be like Saint Paul, the evangelist to all people, when he said in his second letter to the Corinthians, which we hear today, "Brothers and sisters, rejoice. Mend your ways, encourage one another, agree with one another, live in peace." (2Cor. 13:11).

When we try to live as brothers and sisters in Christ, then the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit will be with us all. Let us give thanks to our one God in three persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, for now and always.

Fr. Nimorious writes:

Hi Fr. Jim,

Greetings from Accra, Ghana. I am glad to inform you that all is well with me. The rainy season has just began here and many farmers have started clearing their farm lands. The Church too continues to grow and therefore the need to have more priests becomes more obvious. This explains why I see my new job very important and so far I must say that I enjoy doing that a lot. 6 candidates are waiting to begin their training in the Major Seminary come next September. 4 more are going to begin the pre-philosophy bringing the total number to 10. This is the first time we are having such a big number. I could have taken more but unfortunately some had to drop out after I did the screening. Meanwhile I glad to inform you that I am likely to be in the States next week. One of our SMA priests who was supposed to work in one of the parishes there in the Diocese of Peoria had a problem with his visa and therefore my Superiors have asked me go and replace him. The reason is that I have a 5 year visa and that enables me to travel to the States at any time. I will let you know in which Parish I will stay as soon as my superior discloses that to me. Kindly extend my greetings to all parishioners.
