The Impact of the Ivorian Crisis on the SMA Seminary

For the past 11 years the country of Côte d'Ivoire in West Africa, also known as Ivory Coast, has been a theater of political unrest. The presidential election was initially scheduled to end the rebellion in the country; however, it caused more civil unrest. After polls, two different results were announced: the National Electoral Commission proclaimed one candidate as the winner while the Supreme Court of the country declared the other as the frontrunner. Therefore, both presidential contestants claimed victory.

As a result of this double victory claim, there was a series of sporadic outbreaks of violence between the National Security Forces and the rebels. People living in the country, nationals and non-nationals have suffered a great loss of family members and/or goods and properties.

The seminary of the Society of African Missions, had been part of my priestly formation, suffered severely during this political crisis. If, by the grace of God, no seminarians had been hurt, the same can not be said of the buildings and other properties of the seminary. In fact, there were major outcomes reported: the chapel was profaned; the library was ransacked; the rooms of the seminarians, priests, and offices were robbed; and the few cars in possession were stolen and/or ransacked for parts.

Due to the devastation caused by this cyclonical visit of war malefactors, the seminary seriously needs: roofs to be replaced, plumbing system of the buildings to be redone, rooms and offices to be refurnished, electro-domestic devices and kitchen utensils to be bought, computer room to be re-equipped, and all the doors to be replaced. The estimated cost to fix these damages is more than \$58,142.

Conscious that your generosity gives motion to God's Mission on earth, may these words of our Lord echo in your hearts "*...whatever you do to the least of my brothers and sisters that you have done unto me...*" (Mt. 25:40)
